

Turbocharged Subaru Outback a possibility for Australia

The brand claims it is working around the clock to bring the turbocharged Outback offered overseas to Australia.

Subaru Australia says it is furiously working "closely with the factory" to introduce a more powerful, turbocharged version of its Subaru Outback to satiate demand.

Internationally, the <u>Outback</u> is offered with a 194kW/376Nm 2.4-litre turbocharged flat-four – a detuned version of the engine found in the upcoming <u>2022 Subaru WRX</u>.

Given high-performance versions of its wagon-turned-SUV range have been discontinued since mid-2021 – when stock of the previous-generation Outback's 190kW 3.6-litre six-cylinder engine option ran out – it's understood customers are looking elsewhere for an upgrade.

Speaking to Australian media at the launch of the new <u>Subaru BRZ</u>, boss of <u>Subaru Australia</u> Blair Read said "The customer demand for this model in Australia has been heard loud and clear."

"We're working closely with the factory to try and deliver this for our customers."

Despite historically offering muscular powertrains in its SUV range, Subaru's powerful-yet-aging engines have been falling victim to the global emissions rules.

In 2018, the turbocharged Subaru Forester was discontinued, despite the powertrain representing around one-in-five sales in Australia alone. In 2021, the six-cylinder version of the Subaru Outback was also discon-

Subaru has upgraded its sixth-generation

Outback wagon.

The Outback drifted somewhat from its off-roading roots in the early 2000s, but the 2015 model had enhanced 4WD capability. Up grades were introduced in 2016 and 2021.



Subaru launched its fifth generation Outback with a suite of new technology, premium soft-touch interior trim and a featurepacked infotainment system with speech recognition.

The Outback shared the Liberty's five-star rating for occupant safety from the independent Australasian New Car Assessment Program (ANCAP), with a total score of 35.99 out of a maximum possible 37.

New LPG gas bottle fittings are coming in 2021




New LCC27 fittings rolling out in Australia


You may have heard that LPG cylinders will be coming out soon with a different fitting called a LCC27. Your current gas bottles most likely use a Type 21 or POL Connection.

The new LCC27 fittings have improved safety features, including an easy-to-use right hand threaded external ACME connection, and a back check valve that must be engaged by having a positive connection to the appliance hose before gas can flow. The LCC27 appliance connection also has a thermal cut-out.

LCC27



Has a visible external thread on the valve



Do I need an adaptor?

From April 2021 gas bottles with the new LCC27 valves will be rolled out. You will find them in exchange cages and stores in the coming months. These bottles are backwards compatible to appliances with POL connections – so you do not need an adaptor. You will not need to change anything to use these new gas bottles with your current appliances. Over the next 10 years the LCC27 will take over from the POL connections across the board. Leisure LPG cylinders have a 10-year test cycle, so by 2031 they should be the main bottles in use.

In the coming years new appliances will be released with a LCC27 appliance connection as standard. At that point you will need to change your gas bottles over to the LCC27 version, as these connections will need to match.


POL valve + LCC27 appliance connection



POL Connections still standard

Your current POL connection gas bottles and appliances are still safe and reliable for use, so do not worry if you cannot see a new LCC27 connection on your next cylinder swap. You will only need to make sure you have a new version bottle when you purchase an appliance with the new LCC27 appliance connection. Have a look at your appliance connection, so you can match the cylinder on your next swap!





POL appliance connection

LCC27 appliance connection

LCC27 stands for Leisure Cylinder Connection Type 27. These, and the POL connections will be used for 3.7kg and 8.5kg LPG leisure cylinders. These can be found connected to a backyard bbq, and in your caravan. Larger LPG cylinders including those typically used for domestic home connections will not be affected by the change.

Do I need an account?





Why is it called Battery Track Port ??



The Emergency Medical Information Book - contains all of your information and medical records which is needed if or when an ambulance is called and you need to be transported to a hospital.

When paramedics are called, a typical scenario is that distraught family members may be unable to give correct details of the patient's condition, or the medication they may be on. The paramedics physically have to collect all the patients medication in the house, try and obtain a medical history and take it to the hospital with the patient.

This small book contains patient contacts, service or carer provider information, medications and any medical condition, so a paramedic is able to treat and ready a patient for transport to a hospital.


