DUTCHMANS STERN CONSERVATION PARK THE JULY VOLUNTEERING TRIP

DATES: JUNE 30TH TO JULY 3RD

TRIP REPORT:

Setting off reasonably early on Friday morning, I made my way (via the back roads to avoid the mayhem that is the Port Wakefield road works) to Dutchman's Stern Conservation Park. On the way, I just had to call into the Beautiful Valley Op Shop in Wilmington to pick up a couple of bargains.



The next to arrive was Paul Shinks who had to call in to the rangers at Mount Remarkable to collect some gear on the way.

Richard Temple arrived later in the day and that completed our very small group.



With jobs to do straight away Paul & I replaced the 40kph sign at the exit to the carpark and then began looking at the external door on the shearers quarters top room (which had been removed and left in the anteroom at the Homestead).

While Paul assessed what to do with the door, I walked up to the hikers hut and replaced a blown light globe and took some measurements for the ramp to the storage shed and the sleepers at the shearing shed. I also checked the rain gauge and was pleased to see 70mm had been collected since our previous visit.

Saturday was taken up mostly with preparation for repairs and painting of the door. Richard tackled some of the ever increasing horehound which has been invading for years.

TRIP REPORT (CONT):

To get all we needed to tackle the door, we took a short trip into the rural supply store in Quorn and returned with enough sandpaper and masking tape (among other stuff) to re-do half the house.

We will have enough now to last a while.



While we waited for the first coat of paint to dry, Paul and I headed to the Lower Eastern Track to find and tackle some boxthorn and wheel cactus we had spotted last trip. We would need to come back with a lot more poison!

The painting continued well into the evening and the door was finally ready to re-hang on Sunday morning.



Niamh (our ranger) arrived on Sunday morning to spend some time with us and we set off to one of the rainwater tanks to do some repairs to the float which had stopped working.

Once the door was back in its rightful place and closing correctly, it was decided that there needed to be a door stop put in place so that it wouldn't swing too far if the wind got it. We had grabbed a broken piece of a marker pole and began to dig a hole to use this as the door stop.

The rocks had other ideas! Not to be beaten, a hole was dug and the pole put in place – another job done.

Once again we headed out to tackle some newly discovered boxthorn that Paul had seen while climbing hills to get phone signal.

We just kept finding and killing as many as we could until we decided to break for lunch. Meanwhile, Richard was still dealing with the horehound around the buildings and doing a great job with the new backpack sprayer the rangers had provided. This would become his major task for the whole weekend.


