TRIP REPORT

Dutchman's Stern Trip Report - May 2025 - Report by Debbie Clements

Off we go again.

Due to the recent fires at Mount Remarkable we have had a late start to our working bee weekends in the Southern Flinders but now we are back into them.

Driving up on Friday morning I couldn't help but notice just how dry everything is and how desperate they are for some decent rain. On the flip side, the park is so dry that all the horehound has dried up and died. There is barely a weed to be seen and the kangaroos and goats have very little to eat or drink. Heading along the road from Quorn I noticed a Prado some distance behind me and soon realized it was Paul Ewins as we both turned into the park from the main road. On arrival at the shearer's quarters, we noticed a small note on the table (written on the back of a Pichi Richi train ticket) saying there was a dead kangaroo under the tank stand. One deep breath and it was obvious that nothing had been done about it. Paul Shinks arrived a few minutes later and the first task for the trip was to remove the remains and make the air a little cleaner and fresher.

We unpacked and settled in for the evening – as there were only the three of us, we all had a bedroom each. A few nibbles, some dinner and a few drinks later we were off to bed.



Saturday morning was crisp and clear but we discovered there was a power failure so there were no pumps working, therefore no running water. Shinks had put the old whistling kettle on the stove using the spring water Paul had bought with him, so we could all have a cup of tea or coffee, and the morning could get off to a reasonable start. Buckets and pots were filled from the water supply in Shinks' car and placed in the toilet and by the sink to be used until the power came back on.

Once we got organized the three of us headed out in one car to start our tasks for the day which included laying fresh fox baits and checking the trail cameras. The first track to tackle was the Lower Eastern as it was the closest and shortest. It was also the first place we found a wheel cactus to deal with which was tricky as it was so dry it was starting to shrivel up and it was hard to inject with the poison. Next was the Northern Boundary and along the way, we came across a small group of walkers who were quite surprised to see a car and we chatted for a bit about what we were doing and where they were heading. They had collected some carelessly discarded water bottles along the trail and we offered to take them for recycling with our own bottles. They also said they found a tent but were unable to tell us exactly where and were unable to carry it out. Someone would have been very cold and uncomfortable that night.



With fresh batteries and SD cards loaded into the cameras, we then moved to the Valley

Track and did more of the same. At the top of the last hill we found a few very hardy, small boxthorns that had been fighting the elements for some time and were quite stubborn. Then we spotted some more, quite some way off the track but looking very healthy. Armed with all our gear, we headed across to tackle whatever we could find. When that was done, we headed back for a quick lunch and then on to do the Upper Eastern track and the last of the cameras. One of the camera cases had been used as a hiding place for a very healthy Huntsman spider who was not impressed at being disturbed.

Further along the track, Shinks spotted a wheel cactus off in the distance and when we set off to investigate, we found several others as well. Paul




started injecting them as best he could into their drying pads but found it easier to hit the bases that were still fleshy enough to absorb the poison.

With a very satisfying, long day behind us, we headed back for another evening of nibbles, dinner, camera checking and sleep. Sunday morning saw us starting to pack up and clean up the accommodation as Paul had to head back reasonably early to catch Izzy's football match in the afternoon. Our last task for the weekend was to walk the Dutchman's Stern trail and lay the last of the fox baits. After Paul had headed home, Shinks and I headed off to the trailhead. The last time we did this trail we went anticlockwise, so this time we decided to go clockwise – it wasn't any easier! At the top of the Stern we had a short rest to take some photos and a couple of other hikers came up as well. One of them was also a volunteer a lot further north and we chatted about the work she had done. Then one of the couples that we had seen on the Northern Boundary track the day before appeared as well. After our short rest, we continued down the trail and back to the shearers quarters to pack up the last of our stuff and head home.


