Last month, our founding member Kerry Smith was farewelled in QLD and the below was from Michael Ashcroft – submitted for his service:

Kerry Smith, April 2025

My name is Michael Ashcroft. My wife, Judith & I have known Kerry for nearly 50 years. He sold us our very first Subaru at the end of 1975, & we hit it off from the very start.

Together we started recruiting people from Kerry's data base who had also bought the Subaru & we hatched a plan to start the Subaru 4WD Club. We would stop people at the lights who were driving the same vehicle, & in March, 1976 we held the very first Club

meeting in our new home.

Kerry was the Club's inaugural President.

During his time at the helm (and afterwards) Kerry led many trips and organised many activities – some of which were very sketchy, to say the least. For many years it was a big part of our lives, enjoying many good times together, sharing many adventures and having lots and lots of laughs. It was very family orientated & emp; children also loved the camps.

The Club continues today.

There were lots of practical jokes played, with Kerry sometimes being the perpetrator, and sometimes the victim. Either way Kerry enjoyed the joke and was always up for the next time.

Over the years there are a few memories in particular that stand out that I would like to share....

At the start of the new millennium we were at a new year's eve party at Kerry's discussing the proposed millennium bug. Precisely at the stroke of 12, all the lights and power failed as predicted, causing consternation amongst the crowd....Mind you it could have had something to do with Kerry killing himself laughing at the switchboard

On a club meet to Beachport, Kerry brought along some illegal crayfish nets and while checking them from his boat, was seen from the shore by a fishing inspector.

Despite travelling up and down the beach in his boat, Kerry could not shake him. In the end Kerry landed the boat, ran up to the inspector, greeted him like a long, lost brother and somehow talked his way out of it!

Another time at Beachport we were travelling up a long sand dune with a concealed dogleg half way up. This time the joke was on Kerry. Subaru after Subaru managed to get up the dune, but when Kerry tried...& tried.... he just couldn't make it. Each time he tried with more determination. What he didn't know was that a huge hole was being filled in by the bystanders each time a Subaru came up, & then dug out before Kerry came up. It took him a while to figure it out, but we laughed on that one for many years after. I think Kerry's boys may also remember that one!

There were many nights around a bonfire with Kerry & Dick (Richard McGovern) playing the guitar, & the rest of us singing along to "Country Road", or "The House of the Rising Sun". Many of us from those times still stay in touch. There is a special bond between us that will always be.

Another time was at his property in Yeppoon when he dumped a huge bag of green prawns onto a sizzling BBQ plate to feed the multitude of guests that had just descended upon him. Always so generous of heart & soul.

But unfortunately, all good things come to an end, and it is sadly time to say goodbye.

There are many people in South Australia whose lives have been enriched by knowing Kerry and spending time with him. He will be missed. He was, & always will be a one off.

TRIP REPORT

World's End – Burra Gorge 21-23rd February 2025


